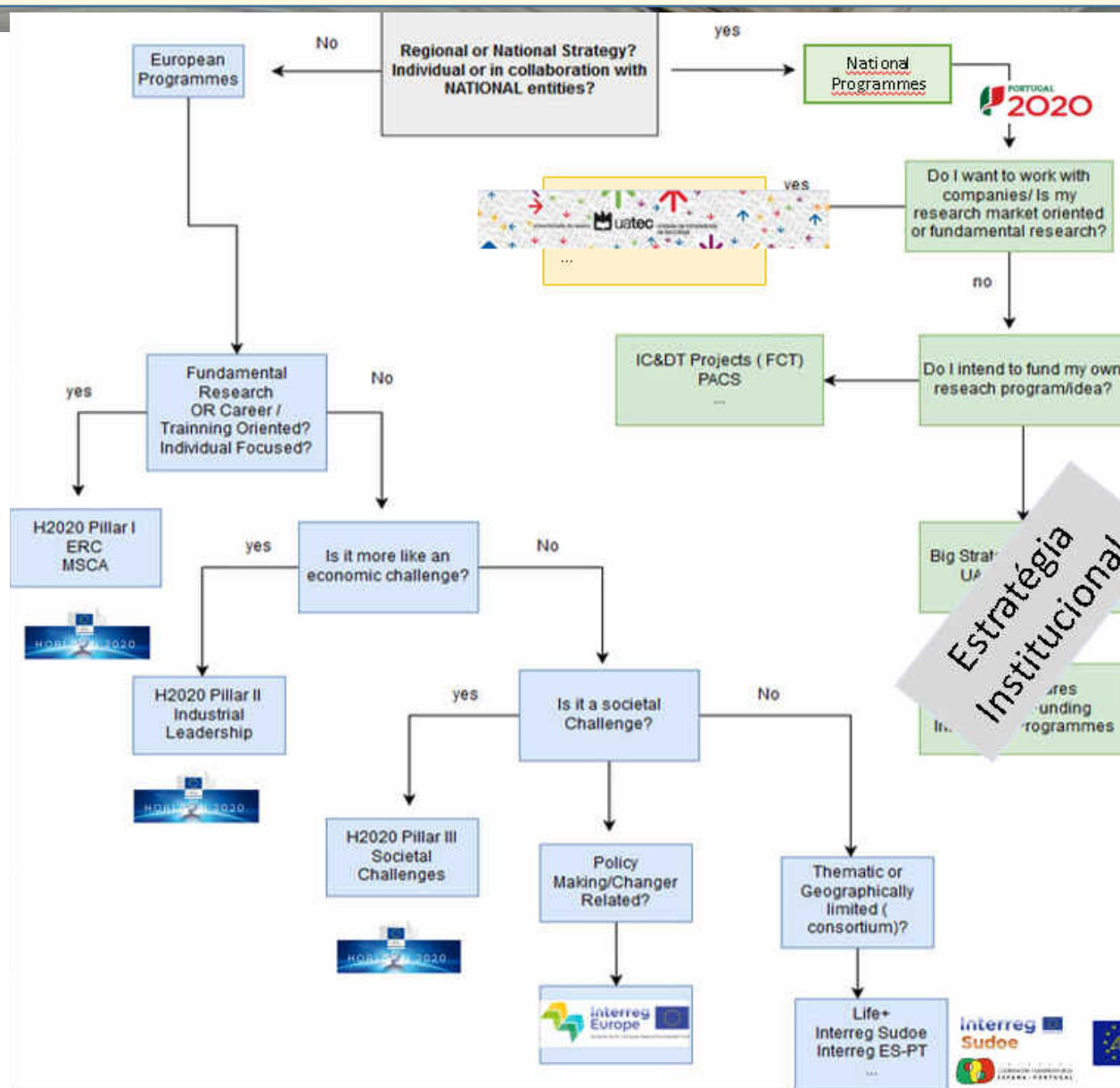

Why choosing an INTERREG program for my project?

- A unique way to share good practices and build your own partners' network abroad
- Your idea has a transnational impact





A good INTERREG project...

- must participate in an overall EU strategy
- has an economic impact
- is sustainable and transferable
- is innovative
- has quantitative and qualitative objectives
- has a diversity of partners
- does not forget to include the horizontal principles of sustainable development, equal opportunities and non-discrimination and equality between men and women



Useful vocabulary:

- The **results** are direct effects resulting from the project and the production of its outputs. They represent what the project aims to change. Outputs such as the organization of interregional events, the identification and dissemination of good practices, the production of policy recommendations are merely means to achieving the results of the project. Unlike outputs, they imply a qualitative value, an improvement compared with an initial situation. They have to be measurable in physical units, such as the number of policy instruments influenced.
- The **outputs** are the tangible deliverables of the project which contribute to the results. They directly derive from the activities carried out in the project. They do not lead to a qualitative judgement on the project's results. In other words, it is not because the project organizes a high number of workshops (output) that it will necessarily be successful. Outputs are typically measured in physical units, such as the number of seminars, site visits, conferences, participants, publications, good practices identified, or policies addressed.
- **Good practices:** it consists in sharing your experience with your partners in order to find the best way to deal with a common issue or challenge.

The average funding for an INTERREG EUROPE project is between 1 and 2M€



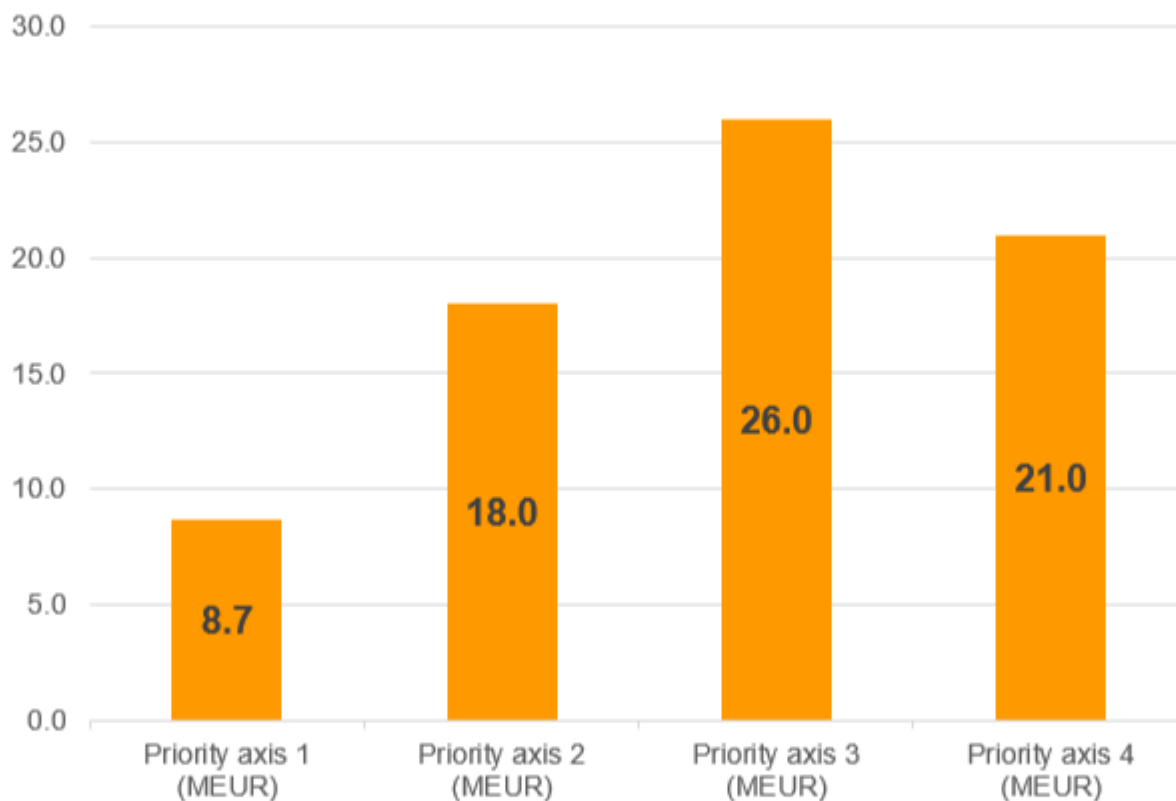

Remaining fund per priority axis (MEUR)





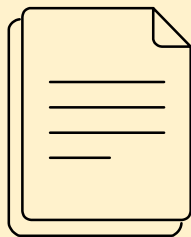

Although not the main target group, universities and research centres can also work with Interreg Europe by *first* engaging with their local policymakers in order to identify options for collaboration

- **85% co-financing for research centres of UA**
- 11% of the 1048 approved partners for the previous calls were education and research institutions



- ✓ Being part of the eligible regions
- ✓ 3 to 4 years projects (for the new call)
- ✓ At least 3 partners from 3 different eligible countries and at least 2 partners from EU member states
